



- We meet immediate needs like food and shelter.
- We provide cleanup supplies and comfort items.
- We help people put their lives back together.

That's why we launched Sound the Alarm fire safety events. Since 2014, committed volunteers have made more than 783,000 households safer by:

- Installing smoke alarms
- Changing batteries
- Helping families make escape plans
- Targeting high-risk neighborhoods





We provide more blood than any other agency.



Every 2 Seconds, Someone in the U.S. Needs Blood

With state-of-the-art systems, the Red Cross delivers blood on a tremendous scale.

- Collecting it in workplaces, schools and our own donation centers – average of 500 blood drives a day
- Conducting at least 12 tests on each blood unit
- Delivering it to 2,600 hospitals nationwide


We teach lifesaving skills like first aid and CPR.

- Vaccinating more than 2B since inception of Measles & Rubella Initiative








